

Dr. and Mrs. A.J.W. Myers Scholarship

Beginning in 1968, Dr. Myers gave five annual gifts of \$1000 to set up a scholarship fund, the income from which is to provide an award for post graduate work in religious education. Dr. Myers was Professor of Religious Education at Hartford Theological Seminary for many years. He is the author of more than 25 religious, historical, and children's books. He died at the age of 97 in December, 1975.

Terms for the Trust as approved at the annual meeting of The Centre for Christian Studies Canada, Inc., March 16, 2000:

1. The name of this trust be "Dr. and Mrs A.J.W. Myers Scholarship".
2. A scholarship fund for post-graduate work in religious studies. Awards can be made to students in the Centre for Christian Studies program who have a university degree or to graduates who are pursuing post-graduate work in religious studies at an institution other than the Centre for Christian Studies.
3. The capital will be invested in perpetuity and only the interest is available for award.
4. Costs of administering and advertising the scholarship may be provided out of the interest earnings.
5. Thirty (30) percent of the interest earnings in each year be added to the existing capital. The balance of earnings each year will be available for disbursement for bursaries as needed. Any unused disburseable funds will accrue to be disbursed in future years.
6. The terms of this trust may be amended at a duly called and held meeting of the Corporation of the Centre for Christian Studies Canada Inc.
7. Should the Centre for Christian Studies continue, but in a new form as the result of amalgamation, or otherwise, then this trust would continue with the Centre in the new form. In the event that the Centre for Christian Studies Canada Inc., might cease to exist entirely, the capital and any unspent disburseables shall be divided evenly between the United Church of Canada and The Anglican Church of Canada, to be held in trust for disbursement to theological students, in a manner in keeping with the spirit and intent of the terms lastly defined by the Centre for Christian Studies Canada Inc.
